



## Principal's Pen

### National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence

This Friday, the 15th of March, we will again be carrying out schoolwide activities to focus on ways that our children can address bullying. Last year, we surveyed our children from Year 2 to Year 6 to get a snapshot of what our children understood about bullying, how they dealt with bullying and their experience of being bullied. Students were asked to answer, in their own words, the question, "What is bullying?" A selection of these responses will be published in our 2018 Annual Report.



The written responses indicated that, while some of our students had an understanding of bullying and all that it entails, many confused everyday conflicts between peers, with bullying. The answers also indicated that as our students mature, many develop a better understanding of bullying and are able to explain it. This is not consistent though, indicating that even in some of our Year 4, 5 and 6 classes, some students still did not fully understand the difference between bullying and single instances of disagreement or conflict between equals. Our students' perception of Goollelal Primary was largely positive. Two areas for attention in future planning will be to encourage bystanders to help victims if they witness bullying and for students to tell an adult if they see other children suffering from bullying.

Overriding all, it was evident that the students of Goollelal Primary understood the importance of sharing, caring and kindness. Our staff discussed the survey results and strategies to educate our students about bullying, and strategies to deal with bullying were formulated and included as aspirations in our new Business Plan 2018-2020 as part of our 'Safe, Supportive and Sustainable Environment' focus area.

## Before & After School Duty of Care

Students who arrive at school before the 8:50am siren are asked to sit quietly on the benches outside their classroom until their teacher opens the classroom door (unless they are school leaders who are helping Mr Rintoul). Doors will open by 8.30 so that children can prepare for the day ahead. Parents are also welcome to come into the Book Nook area to sit with their child / children before school.

I would also like to remind parents that when you collect your child from the classroom at the end of the day, you assume duty of care. This means that if you stay on the school grounds, your child/children must be closely supervised. I do understand that some parents like to take this time to catch up with friends and to enjoy the beautiful weather, but it would be preferable that all children have left the grounds by 3.40pm. I would like to ask that any parents or family members who collect their children from class and then decide to stay on the school grounds, take extra care in closely supervising their children. This includes making sure that children do not re-enter or run around school buildings. This is a child safety issue and can impact on school security.


