COVID-19 UPDATE

Teacher/Parent Meetings must be pre-arranged	Parents and carers can email their child's classroom teacher or school staff, or call 6207 2100, to pre- arrange a face to face meeting time if required.
Visiting the Office	Visitors inside the front office will be limited to no more than 2 adults at a time.
Morning Drop Off and Afternoon Pick Up	To comply with current health advice, we ask that parents continue to drop off/meet children at the school perimeter or use the Kiss and Drive if possible. If, for any reason, you do need to enter the school, please do not enter the classrooms. Children entering the school grounds before 8.30am will be asked to sit quietly on the benches outside classrooms until their classroom is opened.
Kiss and Drive- Staff in attendance on Kindy days	We are extending the use of the Kiss and Drive facility to all parents. A full set of guidelines for the Kiss and Drive is on CONNECT. Kindy children will now be escorted to the Kiss and Drive at 3.10pm (2.30pm on Tuesdays).
Picking children up during the day	Parents and carers who need to pick their child up during the school day should notify the office by emailing Goollelal.PS@education.wa.edu.au or phoning 6207 2100. Parents and carers may come to the office to wait for your child (maximum of 2 visitors in the office foyer)
Attendance	Attendance is now back to normal. If your child becomes sick during the day we will err on the side of caution and call parents or carers to collect them from the school office. If your child is sick before school, please notify us as usual through the Skoolbag app or by emailing Goollelal.PS@education.wa.edu.au

Canteen	Our canteen will be open this term. All lunch orders must be done <u>online</u> using [https://quickcliq.com.au/] Recess items and ice-creams can be paid for with cash at the canteen window.
Assemblies	Due to the 100 person limit and Assembly Area renovations, assemblies will not be held until further notice.
Choir	Choir will not operate until further notice.
P&C and Board Meetings	Face to face meetings can resume with physical distancing requirements.

Open Morning 26th Aug	Classrooms will be open on this day from 7.45am until 8.50am for parents and carers. Please maintain physical distancing.
Father's Day Stall	The P&C will ask for pre-payment and the children will choose gifts from the canteen (as they did for Mother's Day).
Faction Sports Carnival 4th Sep	At this stage we are planning to go ahead with this event but we will be following current health advice. Health advice is that adult visitors and school staff maintain physical distancing of one person per 2 square metres.

How lovely it was this week to receive such a wonderful email from a previous student. Congratulations to Geoff Rintoul. It seems all your hard work has paid off!


Dear Mrs Hartmann,

An emotionally healthy child is happy, most of the time, and wants to learn, grow and make friends; you can help your child achieve this by:

- Understanding your Child's Needs
Children need love, acceptance and security.
- Encouraging Independence
Trust in your child's abilities. Encourage self-help skills such as feeding and dressing themselves. Give them freedom to grow and make mistakes.
- Giving Discipline and Guidance
Be consistent and set fair limits. Teach by example and discuss your values and beliefs.
- Showing your Interest
Talk to your child about their experiences at school and keep in regular contact with their teacher. Avoid putting pressure on your child to achieve.
- Relaxing Together
Make time for family activities you can enjoy together. Plan a "quiet time". Turn off the TV. Spend the time reading, writing or daydreaming.

- **Seminar Series** – 90-minute talks on:
 - children's behaviour – the tough part of parenting
 - raising confident children
 - raising emotionally resilient children.
- **Discussion Group** – small, 2-hour groups:
 - misbehaving
 - fighting and aggression
 - bedtime routine
 - hassle-free shopping with children.
- **Group Triple P** – 8-week parenting course.
