

PILLAR 1: THRIVING SCHOOL CULTURE

WILL BE ACHIEVED THROUGH:

- Proactively building a culture of trust and inclusion;
- High expectations of staff, students and community;
- Honest, open and regular communication; and
- Feedback driving improvement at all levels.

WILL BE DEMONSTRATED BY:

• Positive trends in the National School Opinion Survey for community, staff and students (Years 5 & 6).



PILLAR 2: CONSISTENCY OF PRACTICE

WILL BE ACHIEVED THROUGH:

- Whole-school approaches to literacy and numeracy;
- Evidence-based practices and data-informed teaching;
- A structured synthetic phonics approach to literacy;
- Targeted training for staff; and
- Common assessments and moderation of student work.

WILL BE DEMONSTRATED BY:

- Implementation of whole-school literacy plan by end of 2022;
- Implementation of whole-school numeracy plan by end of 2022;
 and
- Moderation of student work every semester.



PILLAR 3: STUDENT AND STAFF WELLBEING


WILL BE ACHIEVED THROUGH:

- Building strong foundations in the early years;
- An unapologetic focus on literacy and numeracy;
- Year-on-year progress targets for every child;
- Focused support to meet each child's individual needs; and
- Investing in the professional growth of staff.

WILL BE DEMONSTRATED BY:

Year-on-year progress meeting or exceeding like schools in:


- On-entry Assessment (Pre-Primary to Year 1);

At an annual open meeting, the Goollelal Board will evaluate school-level data in the context of long-term trends.
