



PREPARING FOR REMOTE LEARNING

At some point during 2022, your child might be required to quarantine.

Detailed advice will be provided at the time. However, your situation is likely to fall into one of two scenarios.

SCENARIO 1: ENTIRE CLASS IS IN QUARANTINE

The classroom teacher will facilitate remote learning using a platform called Showbie.

Your child's username and password are enclosed.

Showbie can be downloaded as an app, or accessed at www.showbie.com

If you are using the app, your child can log in instantly using the enclosed QR code.

SCENARIO 2: ONLY YOUR CHILD IN QUARANTINE

High-quality online learning resources have been created by the NSW government that enable children to learn at their own pace.

Teachers are not expected to teach face-to-face and remotely at the same time.



PLEASE REMEMBER

You are in the best position to know how little or how much school work is right for your child and your family.

Your child will not be penalised or fall behind if you choose not to take part in remote learning.

Your family's emotional and physical wellbeing should be the priority.

TIPS AND RESOURCES

Please ask your child to let you know before changing their password for Showbie. This will avoid delays involved with teachers resetting forgotten passwords.

If the whole class is required to quarantine, teachers will share a pre-recorded welcome video at the start of each day. They will then convene a live catch-up later in the day for any students who have questions. Families should schedule remote learning activities at times that work for them.

SUPPORTING ONE ANOTHER

During challenging times, Goollelal people always look out for one another. Reach out to families and friends who are in quarantine.

If you are sick or have symptoms, please get tested and stay home.

You should expect some changes in staffing. Don't forget that our staff may be quarantining with their families too. Please understand, during remote learning, teachers may not be as available or as responsive as usual.
